Richard A. Kellow, Sr. of West Bend died on Tuesday, January 7, 2014 at the Cedar Lake Health and Rehabilitation Center at the age of 80 years. He was born on December 23, 1933 in Easton, PA to the late Clarence and Dorothy (nee Detweiler) Kellow.
