Remembering the life of Alice C. Brown



Alice Lenell Randolph Clark Brown entered into her eternal rest on Monday, July 1, 2013 in Raleigh, NC. She was born the youngest of seven children; Lee, Dennis, Tom Jr., Rosa, Charles and Willie Sr., to the late Tom and Carrie Jones Clark of Cumberland County, VA. All of her siblings and her first grandchild, Donna M. Smith preceded her in death.

Alice was educated in the Cumberland County school district. She enjoyed sewing, knitting and baking, her specialties being yeast rolls and sweet potato pies. She was also a savvy bargain shopper. You could find her on any given Saturday at a yard sale or flea market sniffing out a bargain. She thoroughly enjoyed studying God's Word. She was proud to have read through the Bible three times in her lifetime.

Alice accepted Christ as her Lord and Savior at an early age at the Green Creek New Site Baptist Church in Cumberland County, VA, where she was also baptized.

On one of her frequent train rides heading north, the young, beautiful Alice caught the eye of a handsome Navy man, Clyde Brown. He began courting Alice and quickly realized that he wanted her to be his wife. They married on July 12, 1946 and resided in Lynchburg, VA.
